#### Term Fees

If you are paying kinder fees each term, when required an invoice will be placed in your child's pocket detailing the amount, due date and payment options. We truly ask that each family aims to pay their fees on time so that there is minimal time and cost spent on following up.

Private and confidential arrangements can then be made without incurring any late fees. Failure to contact Marisa prior to the due date will unfortunately result in late fees being applied as per our Fee Policy and any unpaid fees of more than a term maybe result in your child being temporarily withdrawn till a payment plan is made and followed through. A copy of our fee policy is available from kinder.

#### Working Bees

We are very proud of our kinder's appearance and feel lucky that we have a beautiful outside area for our children to enjoy. In order to maintain this and the functionality of the kinder, it is important that families participate in their required working bees. The working bee will only take a couple hours of your time and is a great time to socialise with other families.

It's been a very positive start to the year for the 4-year olds beginning kinder. We have had a few changes over the holidays and both groups are now fairly settled. Blue Group is a smaller group with 17 children while Red Group has 22 children.

We began the year with interviews which were conducted in small groups. Parents were then encouraged to discuss anything individually after the group interview. The interviews were great for gaining any important background information about the child prior to them beginning kindergarten. Having the shorter session times and half groups really assists with the settling in process. We were able to assist children on an individual basis and have a much more intimate group with all children being able to contribute. While the interviews were taking place, the children were involved in a variety of activities. Janine and Sharyn found this a great opportunity to get to know individual children, picking up on interests and developing a better understanding of children's personalities and how they may cope on their first week at kinder. It was a great opportunity for the children to become more familiar with staff and other children who will attend kinder with them.

Sharyn and Janine assisted the children with the selection of their own lockers and hand towels and showed them the bathroom. We were also pleased to get some lovely photographs of the children with their attending parent. These are displayed on the notice board and will assist families with getting to know each other.

The children settled in nicely on their first day and the shorter sessions gave them the opportunity to settle in to an environment with smaller numbers of children. The first lunch day came upon us very quickly and the children managed the day very well. Some did appear tired appear tired towards the end of the session. Currently a focus for the educators is ensuring the children have plenty of time to transition between routines giving them time to organize themselves and their belongings. We have begun the year with a program that allows the children to learn to move through the kindergarten environment with confidence and a feeling of success. The play spaces have been kept consistent, so the children can become familiar with the environment, where items are kept, how to access their belongings, the toilets and to feel comfortable and successful being able to take part in all activities with confidence.

Visual charts are displayed to assist the children in managing the routine at the beginning and end of the day. Some of the children are already referring to the chart when they are unsure which is great to see.

Social stories have been read to the children and have been chosen according to the needs of the group and individual children.

We have also begun to introduce some experiences relating to the cultural celebration of Chinese New Year. The children have been observed and supported through the creating of paper lanterns. We were able to document their developing fine motor skills and understand areas of support and extending for future experiences.

Through art and craft activities the children have become familiar with identifying their names to paste on their work and are able to access smocks and are learning where to place their artwork on completion. Our observations of the group have identified an overall group interest in art and craft, water play, trains and block building.

As the weeks move on our program will develop according to the children's ideas interests and abilities taking the whole group and individuals into consideration. We have introduced our treasure box/bag which allows each child the opportunity to bring an item from home to share with the group.

This assists teachers to develop an understanding of the children's interests, their abilities and to understand and communicate ideas and interests with other.

A focus area in the coming weeks will be to develop the children's self- awareness and identity. The children will be looking at themselves in the mirror and describing what they see. This is not only an oral language experience, but it also develops the children's positive sense of self and wellbeing and belonging to our group.

The children have also begun talking about their families and identifying the people in their families through drawings and artwork. We will soon introduce them to a family collage which will form part of their kinder portfolios this term.

We have begun sending home our treasure boxes/bags which each child will have the opportunity to take with them. They are encouraged to place a special item from home in the bag to share with the group. This again is a wonderful opportunity for the children to share aspects of their home life and culture and assists teachers to understands their interests.

At this time of the year we have a focus on ensuring all the children feel safe, secure and supported at kinder. We will be also working closely with all the children to ensure we develop close personal relationships with each of them so they can feel secure and comfortable in the kinder environment.

The weather has been very warm to start the year and the children have had many opportunities outdoors to explore with water. The children are also enjoying removing their shoes in the sandpit and are developing their skills in placing them back on their feet independently. This is a skill we will work on with many of them throughout the year.

Music will be a part of our program each week, group times will vary in length according to the abilities of the children and the time of the day such as morning or afternoon. At present the children are enjoying coming together to dance and participating in finger play songs.

Staff are pleased with the progress the children are already making with our fruit routine. At this point in the year the children are needing prompting to follow our hygiene procedures including the washing of hands before fruit and the washing of their dishes. They have been eating fruit from a shared platter outdoors. Blue group are becoming more confident with supervision in using the tongs to pick up their fruit while Red Group are developing their language skills to ask for their fruit and converse with the adult at the table with them. They have begun washing their own bowls after they eat and placing them on the drying rack.

We have some strict food restrictions amongst both groups and therefore are ensuring the children understand rules about no sharing of foods from their lunch boxes. We would appreciate it if families would remind them of this rule at home.

We have already celebrated some birthdays at kinder with the decorating of a playdough cake which the children have enjoyed.

This year both groups have two additional assistants working in them. Jo and Sylvia are employed by Lentara Uniting and work within each group. They work different hours that have been allocated by Lentara Uniting. They support staff and work with the whole group as well as with individual children. We welcome them to our groups.

We also welcome Merilyn back and thank her for covering staff beaks on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

We have two incursions arranged for term one, both within normal session times. The Banyule Community Health program 'Little Chompers' will visit on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> March for both groups. Children will learn how to care for their teeth and will have the opportunity to have their teeth checked. (Parent permission will be required for this check-up.)

We have the responsible pet program coming on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> March. Children will learn how to approach a dog and what to do if a dog that is not under the control of its owner approaches them. They also have parent education sessions which we encourage at least one adult family member to attend. We have found this to be a very valuable program.

Picnic teas for our blue and red group families have been organised. These picnics provide a lovely opportunity for families to get to know each other better and to become more familiar with the kindergarten and educators. Families are encouraged to bring a picnic tea for themselves on these evenings. A picnic rug to spread on the lawn area is handy too.

Red Group picnic will be on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> February from 5.30 to 7.00pm and for Blue Group families picnic will be on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> March from 5.30pm to 7.00pm. We hope you can come.

Our Quality Improvement Plan continues to be updated. The items we are currently working on are displayed in the foyer for families to view. We encourage suggestions from families about things we can do to improve our kindergarten. Please chat with staff or committee if you have suggestions for improvements.

Thank you to committee for all the work done to prepare the kindergarten for the year. It was great to come back to the centre and finding so much done.

Thanks also to our families who have been assisting during our sessions with kinder duties. We greatly appreciate your help.

Yellow Group Newsletter Report.

Welcome to our new and returning families to Yellow Group. We hope you and your child have an enjoyable time with us at Kinder this year.

Our Three Year Old Kinder program is run on Monday mornings and Friday afternoons. We are called Yellow Group. We have 20 children in our group with Jo (team leader) and Pauline (co-educator).

We are pleased with how well all the children have settled in. First day nerves seem to have now passed and the children seem keen to come to Kinder each session. Lots of cuddles and reassurance has helped each child and family to feel welcome and safe within our

Parent helpers with fruit has allowed Staff to focus on the children while a small group eats at a time. Thank you to all our parents who have volunteered their time to cut and serve fruit. The children are coping well with the transitional fruit time, choosing when they feel hungry and are ready for fruit.

The children are slowly getting used to their routine, its taking time to transition from inside to out and then outside to in, collecting bags and drink bottles etc. We are all learning patience and practise while each individual child is reminded what to do next.

Group times have started with only a small amount of time expected for the children to sit in a group and focus. They all seem keen to dance and sing as they learn new songs and dances. We often play relaxation music and blow our magic bubbles on Friday afternoons when often the children are feeling tired. The program is quite simplistic to begin with. Simple insert puzzles, magnetic blocks, a few pasting materials are offered at the craft table and only one colour of paint is available at the easel for painting. Outside water play and the sandpit are extremely popular. We often open up both the sandpits to allow the children more space to play with different equipment set up in each sandpit. Some Friday sessions are spent outside in the fresh air (weather permitting). Water play allows the children to cool down on warmer days. A trough of water with scoops and water wheels as well as an area set up for washing babies, has been thoroughly enjoyed by the children. Activities change according to the needs and interests of the group and a program is written to reflect these changes.

The children have been introduced to Boris our Travelling Bear, a special bear to belongs to Kinder. In Term Two each child will have the opportunity to take Boris home and write or draw in his diary to share with the group on the next Kinder session. Boris is available during the sessions for the children to snuggle and play with. During our story time each child has a turn to hold onto Boris while we have our story.



Sharing is a skill that many of the group are having difficulty with, so Staff are talking to the children individually and in groups about this. This is age appropriate and something that the children in Yellow Group hope to achieve this year. We are also focussing on our hands are used for playing" and are to be kept to ourselves, while encouraging the children to use their words when being hit, pushed or poked and telling their peers to STOP when they don't like something.

Portfolios have begun. Each child has their own Kinder portfolio which will include an overview of their time in Yellow Group. These stay at Kinder for the year and will go home on our last day. Special days, birthdays and art will be placed in the children's portfolios and are available for the children to look at during our sessions.

We look forward to continuing to help the children establish routines and friendships while learning while at Kinder.
